

LEPPO RENTS EXTENDS DONATION MATCH



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT



During our past contract year, Summit County NEXT, a "benefits cliff" program, participants earned \$157,600 in cash incentives, and 58% completed financial literacy coaching.

This summer, 24 students received full scholarships to our Summer Enrichment Day Camp.

Our STEAM after school program includes classwork and activities that aims to spark an interest and curiosity in science, technology, engineering, the arts and math in children grades 3–5. We teach applicable in-demand skills that will prepare students to become innovators in our everchanging world.

MCCAP



Since the inception of the program in 2020, the Minority Contractor Capital Access Program (MCCAP) has accepted 17 participants who have won 181 new contracts totaling more than \$4M in revenue and created 80 new jobs.

Since July 2021, the Minority Business Assistance Center (MBAC) has helped clients receive over \$5.4M in contract assistance, access \$869,000 in capital, and assisted 66 applicants with earning their MBE, EDGE, or WBE certifications.

RECLAIM YOUR VOTE

We had a great turnout at the Reclaim Your Vote Town Hall hosted by the Akron Urban League (AUL) and National Urban League (NUL) on Thursday, November 3, 2022. The purpose of the town hall was to raise awareness on Issue 10, police accountability and redefining public safety, and justice for Jayland Walker. The event kicked off with Marc Morial, CEO and President of the NUL, sharing the importance of voting in the midterm election. A panel discussion was facilitated by Reverend Mark Thompson, host of the Make it Plain podcast. Panelists included: Jerika Richardson, Esq., Teresa R. LeGrair, Bishop Joey Johnson, Pastor Robert DeJournett, Reverend Nanette Pitt, Judi Hill, and Imokhai Okolo, Esq.

President Morial and Jerika Richardson shared NUL's 21 Pillars of Redefining Public Safety and Restoring Community Trust, which provides a framework for advocacy that redefines public safety and restores community trust between communities and law enforcement. The panelist spoke to the issues on the ballot, the importance of passing Issue 10, justice for Jayland Walker, and how the community can collectively work toward equity and healing. Community members were engaged and asked critical questions to close the town hall. We received great feedback from the community about the town hall, and we are excited that AUL played a role in the passing of Issue 10!









REGIONAL LISTENING TOUR

The State of Ohio Minority Business Development Division (MBDD) held Regional Listening tours across the state, hosted by the seven Minority Business Assistance Centers (MBAC). The event hosted at Akron Urban League's MBAC-Akron center on September 28, 2022, was a huge success! The 51 participants were able to engage with State leaders and learn about business resources and opportunities.

TAKING APPLICATIONS FOR MCCAP

We are now recruiting for the Fourth Cohort of the Minority Contractor Capital Access Program (MCCAP) beginning January 2023. The program is a collaboration between the Western Reserve Community Fund and the Akron Urban League that provides financial and technical assistance to Akron and Summit County-based minority, women, LGBTQ+, Veteran, and Disabled-owned businesses in the construction trades.

Eligible businesses are evaluated based on need, experience, and growth potential. Once accepted, those businesses are given the opportunity to apply for financial assistance in the form of short-term credit to pay for costs related to specific construction contracts.

Participants are also connected to educational resources, including training and certification programs to help their businesses grow. The program is designed to support minority-owned and disadvantaged construction businesses with the best long-term success and stability opportunities. <u>Apply today</u> for the next cohort in January 2023.
