

NEW SCHOLARS ACADEMY ANNOUNCED

The Akron Urban League <u>Scholars Academy</u> has been redesigned to provide a more robust program and allows high school seniors to attend workshops to prepare them for success. The workshop sessions include Self Care/ Mental Health Awareness, Financial Literacy, Emotional Intelligence, Time Management, and a National Pan Hellenic Council Divine Nine Step Show. The Scholars Academy is open to all Summit County seniors graduating in 2023 with at least a 2.5-grade point average who plan to attend an accredited college, university, trade or technical school. **The application window is through October 14, 2022.**

25 scholars will be selected for the Scholars Academy program. All students selected for the program are guaranteed a scholarship. The scholarship awards will range from books, room, and board to full scholarships. <u>Find out more!</u>

MINORITY BUSINESS ASSISTANCE CENTER (MBAC)

January 1 through to August 31, 2022

State of Ohio Certifications obtained by MBAC Participants:

- 19 MBE Certifications
- 16 EDGE Certifications
- 10 WBE Certifications
- 02 VBE Certifications

The Minority Business Assistance Center (MBAC) is one of seven centers across the State of Ohio supported by the State's Minority Business Development Division (MBDD). The MBAC Akron region includes nine counties: Summit, Stark, Wayne, Richland, Ashland, Carrol, Harrison, Holmes, and Tuscarawas. The MBAC's goal is to service small, disadvantaged, minority-owned, women-owned, and veteran-owned businesses.

The MBAC team implemented the "Grow your business with GrowthWheel" sessions to help business owners focus, set goals, make decisions, and take action. GrowthWheel is an online platform that offers a decision-making toolbox for business advisors to engage entrepreneurs after taking a 360-interactive screening of their business. The screening allows the business owner to decide which areas of their business they should focus on first, and the framework encourages them to work ON their business and not just IN their business.

From January to August 31, 2022, the MBAC Team conducted 44 Workshops/Trainings with a total of 415 participants. Sessions included a 6-week Business Plan Writing course, monthly Business Focus and Funding information sessions held every first Friday, Website Development, QuickBooks Training, Navigating Your Cash Flow, Access to Capital, Business Credit and You, Business Banking Roundtable, You're Certified, Now What? and the GrowthWheel sessions.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

<u>Summit NEXT</u> - is for individuals who experience a reduction in public assistance benefits due to an increase in income, commonly known as the "benefits cliff." Since the program's inception in October 2021, members have earned \$121,000 in cash incentives. Earnings were based on members achieving various financial, training, and employment milestones. In the last 11 months:

- 106 members are active in the program
- 80% of members completed a financial wellness class through the United Way Financial Empowerment Center, and 25% of members elected to take additional classes
- 10% earned a wage progression, and 10% earned a job progression

EVENT RECAP

Our summer was filled with so many unique events and activities for individuals in our community! We had the opportunity to engage with many community partners across Summit County and build new partnerships. On August 5th, we hosted a <u>Backpack & Vax</u> Event with the Light Center Recovery and the Ohio Department of Health. Families in Summit County were given free backpacks and opportunities to be vaccinated or boosted. Students were provided free haircuts, manicures, lunch, ice cream, and more. We gave away almost 600 backpacks, and 15 adults and children were vaccinated or boosted at the event!

In the wake of the Jayland Walker killing, the Akron Urban League worked alongside community partners to advocate for police reform. We worked with the National Urban League office to heal the rift between the police and our communities through comprehensive and realistic reform and accountability. We collaborated with the Department of Justice and the City of Akron to host a Young Adult Dialogue. The goal of the dialogue was to elevate the voices of young adults ages 16-26 in Summit County, hear their concerns, and identify solutions. Over 40 young adults participated in the dialogue, and many continue to work alongside the Akron Urban League, the City of Akron, and other community partners to carry on this vital work.

Our summer closed out with two unique events with community partners. We hosted an <u>Innerbelt Reunion</u> on August 28th with the Akron Beacon Journal, the City of Akron, The Freedom BLOC, Project Ujima, and the NAACP to bring together community members displaced from their homes and businesses due to the innerbelt being built. Individuals at the Innerbelt Reunion shared and recorded their stories, participated in healing circles with Project Ujima, and discussed the next steps to repair damages.

Entrepreneurs and minority small business owners participated in a three-part daylong event on September 9th, sponsored by Huntington National Bank. The <u>Seeds for Growth</u> event kicked off with a tour of local minority-owned businesses, progressed to fireside chats with community partners, a community partner panel, and a marketplace, and ended with a networking reception. Attendees' two favorite activities were the bus tour and the \$100 of shopping money gifted to them to shop local minority-owned businesses at the AUL.

TAKING APPLICATIONS FOR MCCAP



We are now recruiting for the Fourth Cohort of the Minority Contractor Capital Access Program (MCCAP) beginning January 2023. The program is a collaboration between the Western Reserve Community Fund and the Akron Urban League that provides financial and technical assistance to Akron and Summit County-based minority, women, LGBTQ+, Veteran, and Disabled-owned businesses in the construction trades.

Eligible businesses are evaluated based on need, experience, and growth potential. Once accepted, those businesses are given the opportunity to apply for financial assistance in the form of short-term credit to pay for costs related to specific construction contracts.

Participants are also connected to educational resources, including training and certification programs to help their businesses grow. The program is designed to support minority-owned and disadvantaged construction businesses with the best long-term success and stability opportunities. <u>Apply today</u> for the next cohort in January 2023.

STEAM ACADEMY

STEAM Academy is a 2.5 hour After School program serving students throughout Summit County in grades 3-5 that includes the following schools: Helen Arnold CLC, Seiberling CLC, David Hill CLC, Firestone Park Elementary School, The Edge Academy, Arlington Christian Academy, and The Lippman School. The program has been reshaped to include an emphasis on the Ohio Department of Education Whole Child Framework. Our students begin the afternoon with mood-calming Zen music to help them recenter and refocus their emotions with a Be Best Circle. Based on the Zones of Regulation curriculum, the students can share their emotional zone and strategies to remain focused and centered. Afterward, they receive enrichment from Ohio State University Learning Extension 4-H program with robotics and coding and Junior Achievement of North Central Ohio with financial literacy and entrepreneurship. Next, our students receive homework help and are immersed in an online learning program called Exact Path. Students are provided with individualized learning pathways to help fill academic gaps in reading, language arts, and math. The STEAM Academy After School program runs through May 25, 2023.
